

MONTHLY MEETINGS: The Christmas party will be Dec 9th at Frank and Nancy Cannizzaro in San Diego. The potluck will be catered. Please do not bring or wear anything with cinnamon due to allergies. Bring your white elephant gift for under \$25. Bring 1 gift per family member that wants to pick their own gift. The January 13th meeting will be at Lenore Wade's in El Cajon. Please bring a dish to share for the potluck and your chair.

MEMBERSHIP: Greg Ruth reported there are 109 active members (families).

MEETING HOSTING OPPORTUNITIES: If you would like to host a meeting please contact Matt Rhoades: venue@koicsd.org. Matt needs venues for April on.

SPEAKING OPPORTUNITIES: Suggestions for speakers or topics are needed and a new VP of Programs is needed. There is a lot to learn about koi keeping and we need to hear what you would like to learn about and/or who you would like to speak/present or can provide the expertise that you need to make your koi experience better! We need speakers for January and April going forward.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Dr. Jessica Lynch reported that the bottom line was down a bit as expected due to starting to pay 2019 KOI SHOW expenses. The final payment has been made to the Fairgrounds for the 2019 KOI show.

JFG: Linda Pluth reported with the cooler weather the Garden is feeding the KOI once a day. The JFG Board approved a budget of \$5,000 for the purchase of KOI for the upper pond.

KHA: Jack Chapman said with the cooler temperatures he has only had 2 calls for fish/pond problems. Pond owners should be watching their fish daily for any problems or strange swimming behaviors.

SHOW UPDATE: Matt Rhoades-a 2019 Show list of the 2019 Show Committee and all volunteers with responsibilities plus the judges was presented. It is not too late to volunteer and get your name added to the show participants. Please contact Matt if interested. Kathy Stewart is looking for trophy sponsors.

Her trophy order must be finalized and ordered by the first of the year in order to get them in time to be inspected, problems solved and available for the show. 200 show pins will be ordered. Reserved/special price rooms have been secured for judges and show attendees who want to make use of them at the Holiday Inn for \$113 a night with a 2 night minimum. We will handle Karen again (Dr. Bob's assistant) to handle check-in and fee collection. Mike is working on publicity for the 2019 show. He will be at the show greeting people wearing his Nemo hat. The fish hats will be for sale.

KHA KORNER by “KOI” Jack Chapman SHOW TIME

We are so close to the annual show I thought I would give it some of my personal thoughts for this month's article. You know it is the one thing our club does each year to advance the hobby amongst ourselves and the general public, which is where our membership comes from. It is the major KCSO event that each member should consider giving a little of their time to help complete

this really fun event, for your time is truly needed in sharing the multitude of tasks that have to be completed. As in most types of clubs a few members carry the majority of the load and from time to time some key members can just get burned out. Our annual koi show is that kind of event, but with the help of a larger part of the general membership it's just more koi fun for everyone. You do not need to be a koi expert to assist in many of the tasks and it's downright enjoyable and hobby educational for all KCSO members. I get to look at hundreds of koi (show entrants and vendor), talk koi stuff (koi and pond) **non-stop** for three and a half days – just a piece of heaven for me HA HA. And, I always go away very tired but thankfully smarter about koi hobby related stuff. So call the show chairman/see him at the January and/or February club meeting and pick a few hours or a day or the entire weekend and come have some koi fun with your fellow KCSO members. If you are a koi hobbyist you owe it to yourself, so see ya at our 32nd Annual KCSO Koi Show. Oh, and maybe take in the Spring Home Garden Show or Gem Faire Show that's there at the fairgrounds the same weekend.

I always like to encourage KCSO members to consider entering their koi in the show and what an experience it is; it's just another way to support the club and the hobby. Most of us are not competing for the major awards (13 Champions) but there are lots of awards for Best in Size (18 total) and Best in Class (20 total) to be had by anybody and don't forget the Novice category awards for first time show entrants – you can even buy koi from the vendors and add them to your show tank on Friday evening. I know a club member who got a show tank and just put 7 small koi (under 12 inches) all bought from the show floor vendors and six of the seven won awards. Time after time I hear our and other koi club members say how much they enjoyed bringing their koi for the first time to a koi show – me included.

It's NOT all that hard. So, go look at your koi, think of the few you would bring if you decided to register for the show. Look up the registration form on our club web page. Estimate the size of your koi on the fish load work sheet, if you don't know the koi classification there is a 'not classified' block at the bottom and do the simple math at the bottom – if your total is less than 100 points then you only need one show tank, and you may have room to buy a koi at the show. Complete the cover sheet and I can speak from experience that the awards banquet is just a lot of fun and koi-items raffle – not the stuffy event you might expect.

Yes, you will need to net your koi and put them in a bag or transfer tank and transport them to the show on Friday afternoon or evening. Get help from friends or other koi club members and if only a couple koi from each member share a tank at the show that is OK if you are alright with that idea.

Some general ideas to think about:

If you don't have plastic bags – you can buy them at the January and February meeting.

Don't forget you need good heavy rubber bands, included if you buy your bags from the club.

I suggest one koi over 16 inches per bag.

I suggest 2 koi for 10 to 15 inches per large bag.

I suggest 4 to 5 per large bag for 6 to 9 inch koi. No Koi under 6 inches.

This is with oxygen added to each bag, but if you don't have oxygen then not so many koi per bag and DO NOT blow air from your mouth; just quickly close the bag to get some air trapped in the bag and transport the koi covered in the dark. I've been known to add a little (couple caps full) of whatever de-chlor you're using for your water changes to the bag to bind the ammonia expressed by the koi on the way to the show. Should be fine for up to a couple hours with our expected cooler water temps for that time of year and when you arrive at the show advise the check-in desk that your koi do not have oxygen in the bag.

Don't feed your koi for 4 or 5 days before the show.

There have been several articles written in the Koi USA magazine about prepping and taking koi to a show and are all well worth reading. As always more left unsaid on this subject than provided here, but hope to give you some things to consider and SEE YA AT THE SHOW!!

Yes, this is mostly a repeat updated article from the past two years.

Lenore Wade is a very active member of the Koi Club of San Diego and she is a key member of the annual Koi Show Committee. As long as Lenore can remember she has always raised fish and with the help of her family she is now enjoying a dream come true. Of course with every dream there is usually an interesting story.

Lenore has been a resident of San Diego for over 50 years and recently retired as a school teacher (but not just your average teacher). Always seeking adventure, Lenore moved to Russia for 13 years where she taught English to dozens of students with whom she still remains close.

While volunteering at Balboa Naval Hospital, Lenore met her late husband who had shared with her his love of Koi that he had come to admire while serving in the Navy stationed in Japan. From that point Lenore always wanted a koi pond and was further encouraged by her brother who also raises koi in Northern California. Now that she is no longer teaching she decided to stay home for a while, renovate her backyard into a playground for her grandkids and of course build that koi pond.

When she mentioned her idea to her local family, her two sons-in-law stepped up and with the help of long time club member Dean Strasser, designed and built a beautiful 2500 gallon concrete pond complete with a beautiful waterfall and sitting bench. The pond water is crystal clear thanks to an 80 watt Emperor UV and 6,000 gallon Ultima II filter. All waste water is recycled and her large yard full of beautiful plants really appreciate that!

With every new pond there are always challenges, what some refer to as the “new pond syndrome” and this pond was no exception. One thing that was learned was that wintertime is probably not the best time to start a pond system as the bio-filter, which is the most important element of the system, takes a little longer to develop when the water is cold. Nitrifying bacteria that removes the ammonia is virtually asleep. It was slow going at first and a few fish were lost but Lenore didn't give up. By that summer, with the help of San Diego Pond and Garden and Jerry Myers' Vagabond Koi Rescue Program, her new pond was a thriving home for 15 koi including two Chinese Hi Fin Sharks. Of course her grandkids have since named all of the fish and Lenore swears that each koi has a different personality. All told her koi are healthy and happy and enjoy munching on their winter diet of Manda Fu, wheat germ and lots of love!

Lenore is avid supporter of Vagabond Koi Rescue and has donated some of her beautiful hand stitched pillows and quilts for auction to support the program. Thanks Lenore so much for sharing your pond and your story with us and for supporting the Koi Club of San Diego!


