**KHA KORNER**

**Koi Poop Watch**

I talk a lot about your koi poop watch, but I've not put it in a KHA Korner article since 2012 so maybe a good time for an updated review. This time of year is a good time to remind everyone about what you can learn from "Koi Poop Watch." Don't you just love it - but you can tell a few important things by observing the koi poop in the bottom of your pond or worse floating on top at this or any time of the year. For my pond early in the morning is the best time to make my evaluation. But first - while not required, an elevated hobbyist practice would for a newly purchased koi to include a microscopic fecal slide examination looking for nematode ova, intestinal parasites and/or other flagellated protozoa, bacteria, and /or helminth ova - like I do for said newly acquired koi prior to them being added to the main pond from temporary quarantine 500-gallon system. I have found that the transfer water your koi has been in will often contain fresh feces which you can collect with a syringe without a needle for your microscopic examination. And, if crazy like me you can collect a larger sample and spin it down in your centrifuge prior to placement of sample on slide. Yes, I do it even if more than one koi in the bag. This is a good time to do a skin scraping for parasites as you already have the microscope out and the koi available. Now back to pond poop watch - if you see a lot or an increased amount of fecal material lying on the bottom of your pond it is a clear sign that you are overfeeding at this time of year for your current pond temperature. This is especially true when you can see the shape of the induvial food pellets singularly or even in a row as part of the fecal stream. Your koi's metabolic rate is reduced as water temp is reduced (by half per 18 degrees C). So, your koi have a reduced requirement for quantity and protein levels and any undigested food is what you see in the fecal material at the bottom of the pond - polluting the water column, increasing ammonia, reduced oxygen and provides the medium for the growth of bad bacteria (Aeromonas causing hole in the side). Observing your koi's fecal material can assist you greatly in evaluating your current feeding schedule.

Stay safe and healthy, while enjoying your koi pond.

I received a frantic text that basically read **HELP MY FISH IS SICK! Can you come get it and make it better and then find a home for it? If you know me you know the answer. I have everything I usually need for an emergency already set up to go, so off I went. I get to the pond all ready to remove a very sick fish and when I looked at the fish I was like HUH? The owner said the fish has red spots all over it and there are 2 big white sores, one on each side. I should tell you the fish is deep egg yolk orange and a doitsu. Well it seems the red spots all over are COLOR spots and the white sores were from where scales had come off mid line and returned without color.**

The owner had actually called the vet to find out what it would cost for him to come out and help the koi. All said and done it would have been over \$300.00. It would have been more depending on the Vet and what they did.

The purpose of this story isn't to make fun of the owner but to highlight that every one of us needs to know basic koi health. There are courses at both AKCA and K.O.I. you can take, some are even free!





# Ten Commandments of Koi Keeping

- 1. Be skeptical of the Marketing Representative. Ask them the “downside” of whatever they are recommending and see what they can say.**
- 2. It will always be your favorite fish that dies. Try never to name your fish.**
- 3. The best Koi are always being held for someone else.**
- 4. Avoid Corn in the top two ingredients of any Koi diet. Fishmeal or Shrimpmeal should be first.**
- 5. Always test first, then you can treat later.**
- 6. Only buy imported Koi after the retailer’s 3-week quarantine.**
- 7. Assume that all new fish are infected with something.**
- 8. You can make your own filter, but buy a no-cut bottom drain.**
- 9. Avoid crowding fish, but if you must, you will need to be a master of water quality.**
- 10. Always be ready to make major water-changes.**

**Editor Note:** I have included the links below so that many of you can have a better understanding of Potassium Permanganate . It is NOT the clubs endorsement of your use of it nor will the club be responsible for any outcome of its use or misuse. It is however part of the learning process and if used properly can be beneficial to your pond. **Potassium Permanganate is extremely dangerous to both your koi and yourself. Please read all the cautionary material on handling and use. I have posted this because a number of people have asked me about Potassium Permanganate Tx**

I had included the Roark article on PP TX but was informed it was outdated and newer information exist that is more precise. Therefore I have added the link to the Roark method in case anyone wants to see what he was doing. I would recommend that if you have never used Potassium Permanganate that you do a bit of research first as it can kill all your koi if not used properly. On the other hand it can be pretty useful if used correctly.

We are all adults and quite capable of making our own decisions, AFTER doing some research and understanding the issues.

I am leaving the links in as a source of information only .

**A Little About Mamoru Kodoma**

**Koi Vet in San Diego Area**
